MORE WEBSTER'S THIRD AUTHORITY

To the Bag:

In his letter captioned "The Authoritative Webster's Third" (19 GREEN BAG 2D 127), Jeffrey Harper notes that "whatever the Supremes' opinions," the *GPO Style Manual* has adopted the much-maligned *Webster's Third New International Dictionary* as the default guide for words that do not appear in the *Manual* itself. As revealed in the *Supreme Court's Style Guide*, the Court shares this view, and goes further:

Webster's Third New International Dictionary is the general authority when questions arise as to the spelling, compounding, or syllabication of English-language words.

S. Ct. Style G. § 4.1 (2016); see also id. § 5.14 (regarding capitalization). One may consult *Black's* or *Ballentine's Law Dictionary*, but only for "the spelling of legal terms not found in Webster's."

The Supreme Court's Style Guide contains the manual used by the Court's Reporter of Decisions in preparing the Court's opinions for public release and publication in the *United States Reports*. It is available for free on SSRN and for money (that will go to me, not to the Court) on Amazon.
