OUR MISTAKES

This time around there is much to correct in our Autumn 2022 issue. First, attentive reader David Hart recently offered this articulate suggestion:

I really enjoy reading these. I believe I spotted a small error, however, in your Autumn 2022 issue. On page 79, in the article *The New Racket*, footnote 1 refers to the “The” before “Black Mask” on the cover but not the table of contents.” If I understand the two illustrations correctly, this is backwards. The “The” is on the table of contents (page 80) and not the cover (page 77).

Hart is correct. That “The” was definitely mislocated by *The Green Bag*.

Second, thoughtful reader Judge D. Brock Hornby complimented us on “the fine piece, *Should I Stay or Should I Go?*” in our Autumn 2022 issue, and then gently inquired about our reference to Yale Law School as “they” on page 20 and then on page 21 to “its” departure from the *U.S. News* rankings.
