Sharp reader Aaron Kirschenfeld spotted two errors in the Spiro Agnew article in our Summer 2023 issue:

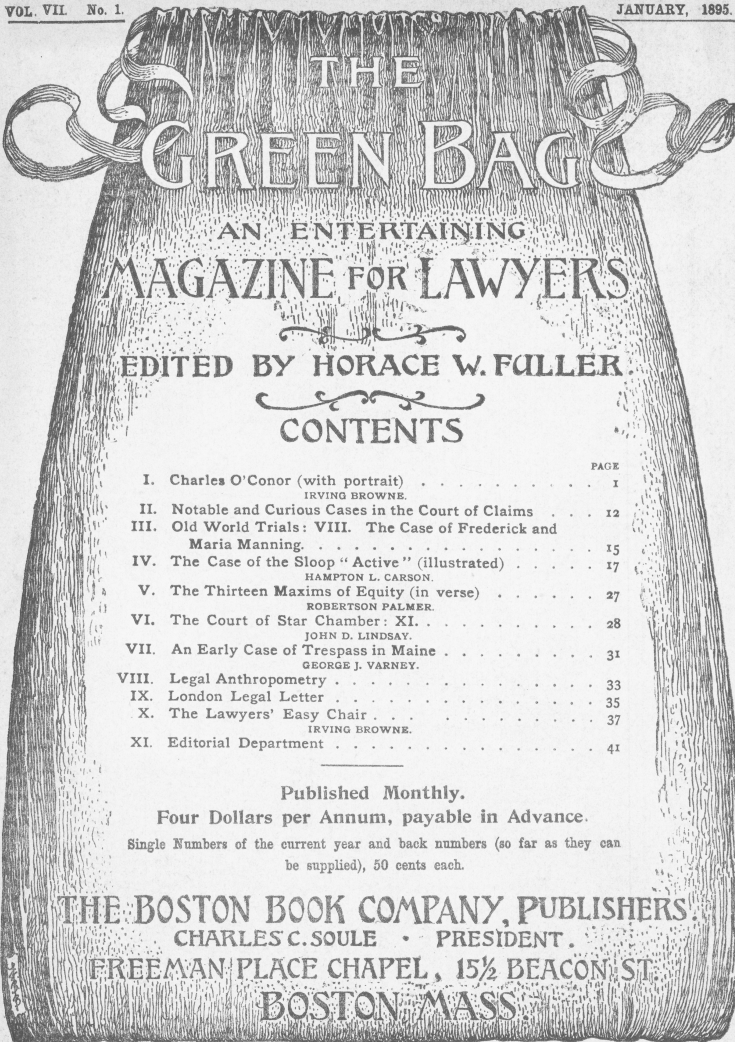

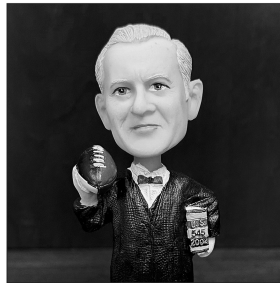
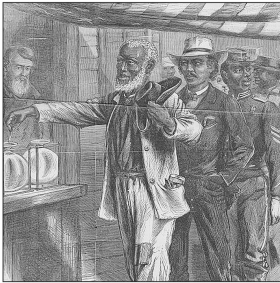
